Just 10 miles to the town of Templeton, 17 miles to Paso Robles, and 14 miles to the coastal town of Cambria, you can easily reach modern amenities, the ocean, or stay home to enjoy your surroundings.

Water

Water on this ranch is plentiful. 4 wells up to 7 gpm (as provided by the owner), seasonal creeks, springs, and a 33-acre foot lake make up with water resources for this property.





Cattle

75-100 pair can be run year round. Cattle handling facilities include: full functioning pens, squeeze chute, and a loading dock for cattle trucks. Fencing consists of barbed wire and the property has one large cross fence bisecting the property.



Recreational Activities

n 1,715 acres, biking, fishing, and off roading are definite options for recreational opportunities. Kayak to the cneter of your lake and cast a line, or take a dip to cool off. Take off on the many trails, steaming with sunlight from the forest canopy, to hike or horseback ride. For the birdwatchers: owls, hawks, warblers, hummingbirds, and puffins can be seen. Hunters can enjoy their pick from quail, dove, wild pigs, and deer.

Plan a day wine tasting. Nearby towns offer a plethora of wineries. Wine Enthusiasts named Paso Robles, the wine region of the year in 2013. San Antonio Lake and Lake Nacimiento are within an hours drive from the ranch. Start out your morning with a hot air balloon ride, then make your way to one of the many local farms for fresh produce and educational experiences, events, and gatherings. Franklin Hotsprings is located in Paso Robles and has therapeutic hot springs, 100 degree mineral water, boating, fishing and paintball.









About Templeton

The Mediterranean climate is conductive to wine varietal farming and many, many wineries encompass the area from Templeton to Paso Robles. Templeton is home to Turley Cellars, one of the first winemakers to modify the fermentation process so that the alcohol content of the Zinfandels was higher than traditional Zinfandels, yet did not present itself as hot on the palate. Notable residents include: Josh Brolin (actor) and Sandy Koufax (Hall of Famer, Dodger Baseball player).



About Paso Robles


Located on the Salinas River, north of San Luis Obispo, Paso Robles is known for its hot springs, abundance of wineries, olive oil production, and almond orchards. Paso Robles is also known as the demarcation of where Northern California ends. The population was 29,793 as of the 2010 US census.


About San Luis Obispo County


San Luis Obispo County encompasses area along the Pacific Ocean between Los Angeles and the San Francisco Bay Area. The county seat is San Luis Obispo. The county is known for the California Polytechnic State University (Cal Poly), San Simeon (Hearst Castle), Cayucos, Morro Bay, and Mission San Luis Obispo de Tolosa (founded by Father Junipero Serra.) The population of the county was 269,637 as of the 2010 US census. Cal Poly, agriculture, and tourism are mainstays of the economy. San Luis Obispo County is the third largest producer of wine in California, surpassed only by Sonoma and Napa counties.







